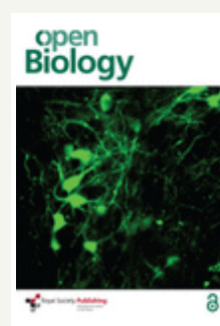


Our milestones

The Royal Society celebrates 350 years of scientific publishing - Open Biology's commemorative piece on van Leeuwenhoek

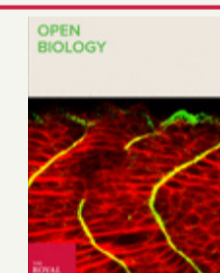


Expanding international board and increasing submission - over 120 editorial board members and over 1200 submissions
